## Additional Support Needs

At our school we try to maximise the resources that we have to support children who have require more individual time. This session we have Mrs McNay every Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday. We have a scheduled timetable.

The Scottish Government has given us an additional source of money called the PEF (Pupil Equity Fund). This will be used to provide a number of children with small group support in building confidence. Also Mrs Bradley will be working an extra couple of hours a week to provide small group support in Literacy and Numeracy.

## Maths assessments and Maths week

We will be celebrating Maths throughout the year, in particular Maths week, which runs from September $10^{\text {th }}$. As part of the school's Improvement plan we will aiming to improve Maths achievements and attainment. Therefore we are introducing a number of new aspects to our Maths, one of which is to introduce a maths assessment at the beginning of the year as a baseline and then at the end of the year the same assessment will be used to measure progress in the year.
The children will be completing their maths assessments shortly; this will provide us with information about your child and then we will support your child to make progress throughout the year. In May they will complete the same assessment and we hope this will provide significant information about the progress your child has made.

National Maths Week is September $10^{\text {th }}$ to $14^{\text {th }}$ and we invite you to visit the school from 2.15pm to participate in activities and find out what has been going on throughout the week. We encourage you to use Sumdog during this week. I will be providing the maths homework for this week.
